John Simpson -Wicketkeeper



A young wicketkeeper making his way up the ladder. Bat in the top four in junior cricket. John has a solid technique. A good driver, who will be capable of scoring 500 plus runs a season in the Lancashire League in the years to come should he not go higher. John is very ken, loves training and he is never without his keeping gloves. A good pair of hands behind the sticks, he is a fine prospect.

The Cat' or 'The Monk' bowls off spin. His run up reminds most people of Monty Pythons 'Ministry of Silly Walks', but he is a very effective bowler, who bowls a very nagging line and length and is very difficult to get away. He has the ability to bowl at the end of an innings when you would not expect a spinner to be bowling. Stuart has represented the LCB, where he has batted high up the order. A good driver who likes to hit through the covers, Stuart is a very enthusiastic fielder.

Steve Dearden



An all rounder who is one of the fastest bowlers in the Lancashire League. A former professional at Radcliffe, he bowls a very quick bouncer and when he's on song a very difficult yorker. A very attacking bataman who likes to get after the bowling from the word go, Steve is strong all round the wicket. A good driver and puller, Steve is one of the beat and most exciting players in the league. Steve also has a good pair of hands and makes a massive contribution to any team.

Alan Howarth



A genuine all rounder, who will not bowl two bails the same in an over. He will bowl an off spinner, a flighted delivery, a slower one, a quicker one, he really mixes it up. On his day and in the right conditions, Alan is a real handful and a thinking bowler. A good driver, Alan can play shots all around the ground. He is a very keen cricketer who turns up about two hours before the match. Alan is also a qualified coach.



The highest run scorer in the League, Mike maintains a great hunger for the game. For the majority of his career, he batted at three or four, but he has opened the innings with great success. Mike has a sound technique which enables the team to build an innings around him. When wickets are falling, he is the man you want in to hold the innings together. A very good fielder, who is first at training and last to leave. You wont meet a more committed cricketer.

Barry Knowles



Formerly an opening bataman, who now bats low in the order due to the strength of the team, Barry now bats around the number eight position. Wherever he bats, Barry can adapt his game to defend or attack. He likes to drive, but he also likes anything short. Barry is a leg spin bowler who gives the ball a fair rip and bowle a good googlie. Barry is also a good fielder who gives the skipper other options with his all round ability. Barry trains regularly and maintains a high level of fitness.

Mike relies on accuracy rather than pace or movement and is very difficult to get away on certain wickets. He is a genuine number 11, who has scored few if any boundaries and if you want six to win with one ball to go, Mike is not the man you want at the crease. That said, he does have a sound defence.

Lee Ingham



At 6ft 4in and still growing, Lee is one of the league's tallest batsmen. His extra reach allows him to play his favourite shot, the expansive straight drive. He is a good athlete and a much improving fielder with an excellent pair of hands.

Andrew Smith



One of the tallest wicketkeepers in the league, Andrew is also one of the most destructive beatemen in the league, ecoring most of his runs in boundaries. He specialises in straight drives which tend to go 100 yards in the air and come down with snow on them. Not quite worked out the art of defence, but on his day he is capable of winning a game.

Asif Mujtaba -Professional



The 36 year old former Pakistani test player is dangerous with both bat and ball. After scoring almost 1000 runs in 25 test matches Asif is currently eritoying League cricket. In recent seasons he has sub pro'd for a number of Lancashire sides including Lowerhouse where he scored a century and took 9 wickets in one match.

Lowerhouse Cricket Club was formed in 1862 and 142 years later the club hosts it's first final of the Worsley Cup and still remains the only club to never win a trophy.

Great professionals have come and gone without success including Manoj Prabhaker (India), Colin Milburn (England) and Tony Dodemaide (Australia) and more recently Australians Matthew Mott, Shawn Flegler and Ryan Harris and current South African Test players Martin Van Jaarsveld and Jacques Rudolph.

Talented and respected amateur players have sweated blood for the cause without any silverware or medals coming their way.

Today, however there is a big difference in the stature of the club compared to previous decades. The club now has over 120 registered players including 75 up to under-17 levels playing in 3 senior teams plus 7 junior sides. The club boasts 10 qualified coaches and has invested heavily in the development of the club and the players resulting in the club being awarded the 'Clubmark' that denotes that Lowerhouse is recognised as an approved focus club of excellence.
