SECRETARIES' REPORT.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE LOWERHOUSE CRICKET CLUB.

GENTLEMEN,—In presenting to you our Thirteenth Annual Report, we have great pleasure in stating that the past season has been one of gradual progress.

At the commencement of the season we had arranged 22 matches ; of which 9 were won, 6 lost, 6 drawn, and 1 ended in a tie. In the First Eleven matches we were victorious in 4, lost 4, and 2 drawn. By the Second Eleven, 2 matches were won, 2 lost, and 4 drawn. The Colts played 4 matches, 3 of which they won, and 1 a tie. The aggregate result of matches played since the formation of the club is as follows : Won 123, lost 74, drawn 43. Total 240.

With respect to our batting and bowling averages of the past season, we congratulate our members on the decided improvement made by our First Eleven ; the highest average batsman being Mr. G. Hargreaves, with the good average of 14 and 1 over. We may also mention that J. Hartley and Gascoigne our professional, batted well for 12 and 5 over, and 11 and 5 over. In the Second Eleven Mr. T. Sagar has an excellent average of 41 runs per innings. As to the bowling averages, S. Gascoigne stands first, with an average of 6·12 runs per wicket. In the Second Eleven, T. Johnson has an excellent average of 3·4 runs per wicket.

With respect to the finances of the Club, your Committee is exceedingly glad to state that they are in a satisfactory condition. Total receipts of the Club for the Year are £180 8s. 0d., and the expenditure £146 12s. 3d., leaving a balance of £33 15s. 9d. to the credit of the Club.

Mr. S. Gascoigne having given general satisfaction as a bowler and batsman, the Committee have engaged him for the coming season 1876.

In conclusion, we, on behalf of the Committee, take the opportunity of expressing our warmest thanks to our employers (Messrs. John Dugdale and Bros.) and all other honorary members, for their liberal support, and respectfully solicit all pecuniary assistance possible in order to aid your Committee in promoting the welfare and interest of the Club.
