## SECRETARIES' REPORT.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE LOWERHOUSE CRICKET CLUB. GENTLEMEN,

In presenting to you this Season's Report, we have great pleasure in stating that our Club is in a very healthy condition, both financially, and as regards the number of young Members.

At the commencement of the Season we had arranged 22 Matches, of which 9 were won, 6 lost, and 7 drawn.

In the first eleven we were victorious in 4, lost 5 and 5, drawn.

By the second eleven 5 matches were won, 1 lost, and 2 drawn.

The aggregate result of Matches played since the formation of the Club is as follows; Won, 140; Lost, 88; drawn, 58; total, 286.

With respect to our Bowling and Batting averages, we regret that we cannot report any improvement in the bowling of our First Eleven this Season. In the Second Eleven the bowling of T. Johnson and J. Rooinson, was very good, the former again being first, with an average of 4 and 9 over. As to our Batting averages, although not high, they have been obtained by good and sound Cricket, A. Thornton deserving special mention for his average of 19 and 5 over.

As to the Financial state of the Club, the total receipts are £285 19s.  $9\frac{1}{2}$ d., and the expenditure £226 1s. 3d., leaving a balance of £59 18s.  $6\frac{1}{2}$ d. to the credit of the Club.

Mr. J. Sykes, of Huddersfield, has been engaged as Professional for the coming Season 1878.

In conclusion, we, on behalf of the Committee, take the opportunity of expressing our warmest thanks to our employers (Messrs. John Dugdale and Bros.), and all other honorary members for their liberal support and respectfully solicit a furtherance of the same.
