## SECRETARY'S REPORT.



To the Members of the Lowerhouse Cricket Club.

GENTLEMEN,

In presenting to you the Twenty First Annual Report, I am glad to be able to report the past season as a successful one. At the commencement of the season we had arranged 26 matches., 11 of which were won, 7 lost, 5 drawn, 2 not played through unfavourable weather, and 1 cancelled.

The First Eleven won 6, lost 5, 1 not played, and 4 were drawn.

By the Second Eleven 5 were won, 2 lost, 1 drawn, 1 not played, and one cancelled.

The total result of Matches played since the formation of the Club is as follows : Won 188, lost 123, drawn 94, Total 405.

I am glad to be able to report an improvement in both our batting and bowling averages for this season, which I respectfully commend to your perusal.

I am also happy to inform you that our finances are again in a very satisfactory state, although we were unfortunate in having wet days for our principal Matches, and also for our Athletic Sports.

The total receipts for the year are £218 15s. 7d.. and expenditure £197 14s. 3d. leaving a balance of £21 1s. 4d.

In conclusion I, on behalf of the Committee, take the opportunity of expressing their warmest thanks to Messrs. John Dugdale & Bros., and all other Honorary Members for their liberal support, and hope for a continuance of the same.
