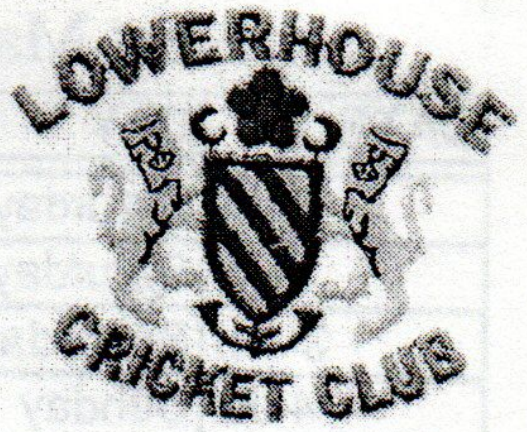

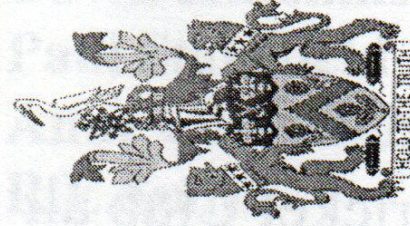

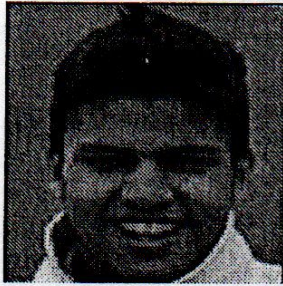

RACE NIGHT 25th June



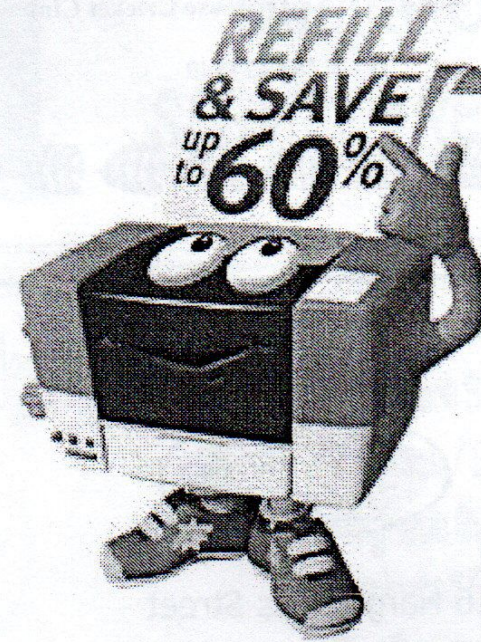

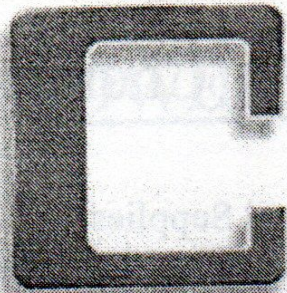
