

MEET THE TEAMS

In this week's game we see a battle of the West Enders, with tenth placed Lowerhouse entertaining fourth placed Church and Oswaldtwistle C.C. Church are having a fine season and reached the 20-20 final as well as being prominent in the League. Ammer Mirza is a great batting recruit from Blackburn Northern. Levi Woolfenden is as fine an all-round prospect as any in this area and Andrew Bentley is a more than decent bowler. With this core of players and a high riding second eleven, Church should have hopes of ending their trophy drought sooner rather than later. Last Sunday they had an emphatic 10 wicket win against Worsley Cup winners Colne. Meanwhile Lowerhouse meandered their way up the A56 to the Snake Pit a.k.a. Bentgate. The 'House had surprised the reptiles in the reverse fixture chasing down a daunting 264 for victory. No crocodile tears were shed. Fangs for the memory! It was always going to be a tough task versus a chameleon-like Haslingden eager for revenge. Although the Hassy alligator teeth were filed and sharpened, 'House began strongly and had the croc by the tail at 35-4. Dearden, Hugo and Read responded and grafted through the jungle quicksand to make a much above par score of 189. At half-time 'House's chances were roughly equal to the Light Brigade going into the Valley of Death. Lizards to the left of us, salamanders to the right. Extras (25) and Joe Martin (16) top scored before the Hassy boa constrictor strangled and crushed all breath from the Lowerhouse body on the score of 99.

Maybe because there are so many teams in the Accy area, and talent is therefore spread, their teams haven't won as many honours as many other Lancashire League clubs. That sentiment certainly applies to Church C.C. They have won 5 Championships but only 1 Worsley Cup. The team first won the League in 1939 and turned that into a hat-trick. They also concluded the Second World War in 1945 with a fourth win in 7 years. This short period of time was clearly Church's golden era. The next and, so far, last title success, came in 1962, with that fine fast bowler Chester Watson to the fore. He took 119 wickets at less than 8 as well as scoring around the 400 runs mark.

Church had lost 3 Worsley Cup finals before decisively defeating Nelson in the 1974 final. Nelson had defeated the 'House in the semi that year in a game dominated by Collis King. Trevor Jones swears he had the exciting West Indian plumb L.B.W. long before he'd achieved his 125(out of 188) final score, but his frantic appeal was rejected. Nelson's luck ran out versus Church as they went from 29-0 to 68 all out. That prolific amateur bowler Jack Houldsworth took 6-24 and a 8 wicket victory became Church's last honour. Since then it's been near misses only for the club and they have the longest trophy drought amongst Lancashire League clubs. In the 2002 season Church thrashed the 'House in the Cup semi-final before losing an unsatisfactory final at modern day cup kings Ramsbottom. In 2004 pro Ruwin Peiris had a superb year but Hassy just pipped the West Enders by 5 points. Both sides had won 16 games but what should have been the showdown was waterlogged off. There were thoughts that the Bentgate ground could have been fit if an effort had have been made. Would the reptiles have been happy to win in that fashion? You decide.

Some of Church's famous pro's have included the ill-fated Frank O'Keefe, Polly Umrigar, Tommy Lowe jnr, Shafiq Ahmed and Mike Watkinson.

The club's lack of on-field success hasn't daunted them and they have the most loyal fan base in the Accy area. Their ground is always neat and tidy and they've managed to list all their scorecards since 1892 on their excellent website. This must have been a monumental task and it is a commendable achievement.

One of the loyal fan base is Keith Fairhurst of Royal Mail Accrington. Keith, like our own Charlie Chipps, has a great repertoire of songs, from those of Frank Sinatra to Dean Martin, and Tony Bennett to Matt Monro. No offence meant Keith but I hope you're singing "Portrait Of My Loss" to-night, softly while you leave us.



A successful wicket keeping course run by Qas Ali took place at the club with 10 LHCC keepers in attendance along with others from other clubs.

GROUNDSMAN OF THE MONTH




Peter Tighe has won the groundsman of the month award for the 5th month running. The award is judged by our readers and he recieves a cream bun out of Oddies window.
