#### BACK ON THE WINNING TRAIL AS LEAGUE LEADERS ARE TOPPLED

Saturday July 12th Nelson 151 - 5

Ramsbottom 152 - 4

On a lovely warm sunny afternoon, Ramsbottom probably turned in their best performance of the season, to restrict league leaders Nelson to 151 off 50 overs. Veteran Mark Price excelled, bowling 25 overs unchanged in the sweltering heat to record brilliant figures of 4 – 57. After Nelson had won the toss and elected to bat they must have had visions of 200+ on what looked a good batting track, but the opening Ramsbottom bowlers made them fight for every run. After Mike Haslam had removed Nelson opener Heap the Nelson Pro Joe Scuderi strode to the wicket with a purposeful stride. He looked in ominous nick as he opened up with a flashing cover drive for 4. Scud quickly raced into double figures before the wily Price did him with a slow full toss, which forced him to change his shot. The mistimed ball flashing into the grateful hands of Pro.Arnberger at short cover. The Nelson veteran Paul Garaghty joined the Nelson opener Marshall at the crease but such was the control of the Ramsbottom bowling attack that it took Nelson 38 overs to post three figures. At that point a frustrated Marshall gave Price the charge completely missing the ball to the delight of the Ramsbottom skipper Richard Hevingham who had the bails off in a flash.

Nelson, in the last few overs, tried to up the tempo and although there was a late flurry Mark Price always had the upper hand restricting Nelson to just 151. The Nelson bowling attack had been firing on all cylinders in previous weeks so the result was no formality. It all depended on the start, it was soon apparent that Pro. Jason Arnberger had had raw steak for tea as he gave the Plams a flying start with a positive display of batting, the tins on the old scoreboard were soon whizzing round. Spencer Woods played his part as the opening pair put the game well beyond Nelson scoring 116 before the first wicket fell. Occasional spinner Marshall got both openers out (Pro. 67 Spencer 34) and, despite a mini collapse David Bell 17 n.o. steered the

Rams home with over 8 overs to spare - a great win for the Rams.

## A GAME THAT WE DID EVERYTHING BAR WIN

Sunday July 13th Ramsbottom 229 - 7 Church 235 - 6

On a cracker of a day, Ramsbottom batted first, on a pitch that looked like a billiard table, the best wicket of the season, which is saying something. Add to that Pro Amberger, in top form of late. The many touchline expens dotted round the ground were talking 250+ as play got underway. Their confidence seemed to be justified as Ramsbottom got off to a very good start with Pro. Arnberger looking in complete control. Disaster struck when he had made 36, he was out to a poor shot dabbing at very wide ball. He looked as sick as a parrot trudging off the pitch like "Droopy Duck" (as featured on electronic scoreboards.) The side's two youngest players Spencer Woods and David Bell took the game to Church adding 64 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> wicket before David was out for a well struck 43. Spencer went on to complete his maiden half-century and with Mark Dentith smashing a rapid 39 n.o. at the end of the innings Ramsbottom had posted a respectable score. On such a good wicket, (you could not tell it had been played on at half time) it was not an impossible score to beat. Early wickets were the order of the day evergreen Mark Price carried on the good work from the previous day dismissing their skipper Sykes (ton day before) in the first over and then the potentially dangerous Aspin with the score on 35. This brought the sub Pro Semple to the wicket who after a careful surveillance gradually upped the tempo playing some nice shots to all parts of the ground. With the dismissal of Fergusson at 75 he was joined by ex Stand Pro Seedle, it was the signal for the Rammy fielding to go to pot Seedle enjoyed a charmed life as he added 80 runs with the Pro. With Church looking in command at 179 Semple made his first and last mistake holing out to the square leg boundary, this was the signal for the home team bowlers to put the brakes on the Church batsmen. Church resorted to taking risky singles to keep the runs flowing but abysmal fielding and throwing by the Rams team helped them, perhaps the baking hot sun had taken its toil. 26 runs were still required off the last 3 overs making Ramsbottom "Red Hot" favourites but Westwell had not read the script as he put Church right back in it with 17 off Pro Arnberger's penultimate over. Price was again the pick of the bowlers and a typical tight over ensured that the game went to the wire. Another 6 into the pavilion from Westwell saw Church home with 2 balls to spare, leaving the home supporters shaking their heads wondering how things could change in just 24 nours, a funny old game is cricket, you never can tell, that's why we all like it so much.

In reply Ramsbottom had no problems scoring the required runs Robert Read top scored with 38 n.o. backed up by good knocks from skipper Julian Marcroft and Chris Wood.
